Vince Chambers from Thunder Bay wins two Six Arrows events in a row. Wow! He was in another tough field of Men's Masters. Second place winner, Jerrod Spence from Winnipeg area, took first place in the Men's Open at Fortune Bay in September moving him to the Masters. Both Jerrod Spence and Jeff Clare have moved up to the competition in the Men's Masters. Great Shooting guys!

The women's divisions had Lisa Hunt from Winnipeg in the drivers' seat until Lisa Mitchell from Cass Lake upset Lisa's no loss record by beating her the first game. Lisa Hunt came back to win \$600 in the Rising Stars. This win moves Lisa up to the Stars of the North, the women's upper division, which includes Master players and top AA as well as Rising Stars winners from previous Six Arrows tournaments.
